

















Index of GDP per capita, 1980-2000, 1980 = 100



East Asia & Pacific Latin America & Caribbean Middle East & North Africa






1 billion people lifted out of poverty

Number of people living on less than 2005 PPP \$1.25 a day (billions)




China Poverty headcount ratio at \$1.90 a day (2011 PPP) (% of population)


Agenda 2030 has not much on migrants, refugees


